## What is this service, and why is it taking place?

In the Church of England Canon C4:3 states:

"No person shall be admitted into holy orders who is suffering, or who has suffered, from any physical or mental infirmity which in the opinion of the bishop will prevent him from ministering the word and sacraments or from performing the other duties of the minister's office."

In 2017, Rachel was diagnosed with ADHD, with Bipolar, and more recently with Autism. In the years since diagnosis, there have been various misunderstandings, ignorance and fear; some had described Rachel as an anomaly as a priest, and questioned her ordination. Rachel had been left feeling devalued and uncertain.

These challenges have overlapped with the global pandemic during which Rachel was identified as clinically extremely vulnerable and was shielding. This has also been a challenging season for the Diocese of Winchester, which the Archbishop has described as "The last years in the Diocese of Winchester and especially 2021 have been characterised by difficult relationships and by disappointment, leading to anger and indeed to crisis."

In this service, there will be a lament for the ways that we accidentally exclude and other people. Rachel will repeat the promises that she made at ordination, and the Bishop of Southampton will anoint her with oil, affirming her ordination.

Ministry is always carried out in relationship with others. In this service, we will pray blessing for the team here for ministry in Pennington. In January, the Archbishop reminded us of the importance of building "relationships with each other that reflect the intimacy of the love of God that is lavished so abundantly on us." Our prayer is that this service will be a blessing of reconciliation and restoration for us all.

#### For Reflection before the service:

#### In the Image of My Father

Made in the image of my Father: breath-filled, his will to live kindling my life, his call to be driving my being. My heart is sparked by his heart; my mind is fired by his imagination. My animation is his declaration: because he is, I am.

# **Greeting**

condoned, encouraged, applauded and perpetrated. Give your people courage to resist, wisdom to know how to respond, solidarity to stand together, inspiration to model a better way, and patience to endure until justice and mercy embrace.

God of the rainbow

Fill your Kingdom with justice and mercy.

God of resurrection, in whom the future is always bigger than the past, in Revelation you promise a time when you yourself will be with us, when you will wipe every tear from our eyes, when mourning and crying and pain will be no more, and your Son will make all things new. Yet among your people there have been so many tears when there should have been celebration, so much mourning and crying and pain inflicted, and still today there are so many ways in which your children are downtrodden and patronized and demonized and under attack. Put a new song in our hearts, lift the voices of truth, bring the refining fire of your transformation, and let your glory roll like a never failing stream.

#### **Proclamation of the Gospel**

Read by Fiona MacMillan, Trustee of Inclusive Church, leads Disability Advisory Group and Disability Conference at St Martin in the Fields

God who said: 'Let light shine out of darkness'
has caused his light to shine within us
to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God
revealed in the face of Jesus Christ.
We have this treasure in earthen vessels
to show that the power belongs to God.

Hear the words of the Gospel according to John. (John 4:1-30, 39-42) **Glory to you, O Lord.** 

Now when Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard, 'Jesus is making and baptizing more disciples than John'— although it was not Jesus himself but his disciples who baptized— he left Judea and started back to Galilee. But he had to go through Samaria. So he came to a Samaritan city called Sychar, near the plot of ground that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired out by his journey, was sitting by the well. It was about noon.

A Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus said to her, 'Give me a drink'. (His disciples had gone to the city to buy food.) The Samaritan woman said to him, 'How is it that you, a Jew, ask a drink of me, a woman of Samaria?' (Jews do not share things in common with Samaritans.) Jesus answered her, 'If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, "Give me a drink", you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water.' The woman said to him, 'Sir, you have no bucket, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water? Are you greater than our ancestor Jacob, who gave us the well, and with his sons and his flocks drank from it?' Jesus said to her, 'Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.' The woman said to him, 'Sir, give me this water, so that I may never be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water.'

Jesus said to her, 'Go, call your husband, and come back.' The woman answered him, 'I have no husband.' Jesus said to her, 'You are right in saying, "I have no husband"; for you have had five husbands, and the one you have now is not your husband. What you have said is true!' The woman said to him, 'Sir, I see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshipped on this mountain, but you say that the place where people must worship is in Jerusalem.' Jesus said to her, 'Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is

coming, and is now here, when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father seeks such as these to worship him. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth.' The woman said to him, 'I know that Messiah is coming' (who is called Christ). 'When he comes, he will proclaim all things to us.' Jesus said to her, 'I am he, the one who is speaking to you.'

Just then his disciples came. They were astonished that he was speaking with a woman, but no one said, 'What do you want?' or, 'Why are you speaking with her?' Then the woman left her water-jar and went back to the city. She said to the people, 'Come and see a man who told me everything I have ever done! He cannot be the Messiah, can he?' They left the city and were on their way to him.

Many Samaritans from that city believed in him because of the woman's testimony, 'He told me everything I have ever done.' So when the Samaritans came to him, they asked him to stay with them; and he stayed there for two days. And many more believed because of his word. They said to the woman, 'It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the Saviour of the world.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

## **Affirmation of Ordination**

Rachel stands before the Bishop, who addresses the congregation

Priests are called to be servants and shepherds among the people to whom they are sent. With their Bishop and fellow ministers, they are to proclaim the word of the Lord and to watch for the signs of God's new creation. They are to be messengers, watchmen and stewards of the Lord; they are to teach and to admonish, to feed and provide for his family, to search for his children in the wilderness of this world's temptations, and to guide them through its confusions, that they may be saved through Christ for ever. Formed by the word, they are to call their hearers to repentance and to declare in Christ's name the absolution and forgiveness of their sins.

With all God's people, they are to tell the story of God's love. They are to baptize new disciples in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and to walk with them in the way of Christ, nurturing them in the faith. They are to unfold the Scriptures, to preach the word in season and out of season, and to declare the mighty acts of God. They are to preside at the Lord's table and lead his people in worship, offering with them a spiritual sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. They are to bless the people in God's name. They are to resist evil, support the weak, defend the poor, and intercede for all in need. They are to minister to the sick and prepare the dying for their death. Guided by the Spirit, they are to discern and foster the gifts of all God's people, that the whole Church may be built up in unity and faith.

## The bishop addresses Rachel directly

Today, I invite you to affirm the declarations that we put to you when you were ordained deacon and priest – when you devoted yourself to God's service, so that as you daily follow the rule and teaching of our

Lord and grow into his likeness, God may sanctify the lives of all with whom you have to do.

Do you accept the Holy Scriptures as revealing all things necessary for eternal salvation through faith in Jesus Christ?

Rachel I do so accept them.

Will you be diligent in prayer, in reading Holy Scripture, and in all studies that will deepen your faith and fit you to bear witness to the truth of the gospel?

Rachel By the help of God, I will.

Will you lead Christ's people in proclaiming his glorious gospel, so that the good news of salvation may be heard in every place?

Rachel By the help of God, I will.

Will you faithfully minister the doctrine and sacraments of Christ as the Church of England has received them, so that the people committed to your charge may be defended against error and flourish in the faith? *Rachel* By the help of God, I will.

Will you, knowing yourself to be reconciled to God in Christ, strive to be an instrument of God's peace in the Church and in the world?

Rachel By the help of God, I will.

Will you fashion your life according to the pattern of Christ, to give wholly of yourself without losing your sense of self, caring for your mind, your body, your spirit, that you may be a pattern and example to Christ's people?

Rachel By the help of God, I will.

Will you work with your fellow servants in the gospel for the sake of the kingdom of God?

Rachel By the help of God, I will.

Will you accept and minister the discipline of this Church, and respect authority duly exercised within it?

Rachel By the help of God, I will.

Will you then, in the strength of the Holy Spirit, continually stir up the gift of God that is in you,to make Christ known among all whom you serve?

Rachel By the help of God, I will.

The congregation stand, and Rachel turns and faces them.

Brothers and sisters, you have heard how great is the charge that Rachel has undertaken, and you have heard her declarations.

Will you continually pray for her?

All We will.

Will you uphold and encourage her in her ministry?

All We will.

Rachel turns back to face the bishop, who continues, addressing her. In the name of our Lord we bid you remember the greatness of the trust that has been committed to your charge. Remember always with thanksgiving that the treasure entrusted to you is Christ's own flock, bought by the shedding of his blood on the cross. It is to him that you will render account for your stewardship of his people.

You cannot bear the weight of this calling in your own strength, but only by the grace and power of God. Pray therefore that your heart may daily be enlarged and your understanding of the Scriptures enlightened.

Pray earnestly for the gift of the Holy Spirit.
